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Test Afterschool - Program Self-Assessment Survey

Rating Scale Instructions with Standards-Based Practices

4 = Excellent/Exceeds Standard

Exceeds Standard (4) means that the program is exceptional or outstanding in this area because it implements nearly all or all of the Standards-Based Practices for this indicator. The relevant Standards-Based Practices are demonstrated in clearly observable ways.

3 = Good/Meets Standards

Meets Standard (3 to 3.9) means that the program executes many of the Standards-Based Practices. The rater can generate examples of how and when the program executes these specific practices. This is an area the program executes well.

2 = Some Progress Made/Approaching Standard

Approaching Standard (2 to 2.9) means that the program is working toward executing Standards-Based Practices, but is currently only implementing a few of them. The program may benefit from targeted assistance in order to implement more of the Standards-Based Practices.

1 = Must Address and Improve/Standard Not Met

Standard Not Met (1 to 1.9) means that the program is not currently implementing any of the Standards-Based Practices and requires significant support in this area. There is a need for significant support to get on track to address this indicator.

0 = Don't Know/Not Applicable

This rating indicates that the program is not familiar enough with this indicator to rate performance or is just not sure how to rate it at this time. This rating could also mean that the indicator simply does not apply to the site or program.

Observable Evidence Statements

Use of the following evidence statements may require some revisions to the scoring instructions currently available in the User's Guide. For example, implementation of MOST of the statements under each indicator might warrant a rating of a "3", but implementation of ALL of the statements would warrant a rating of "4". 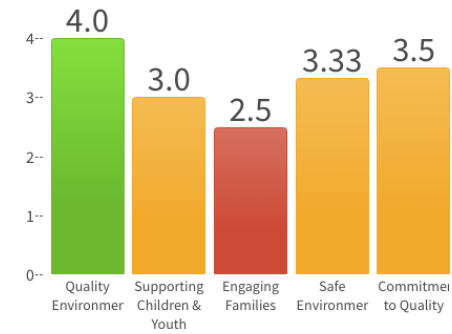

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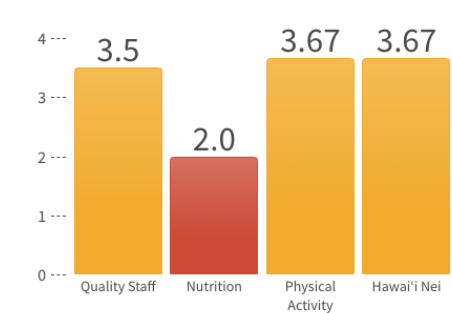

Funding – State Level

- R.E.A.C.H program - \$500,000
- Grant-In-Aids – 2018 \$580,000

Funding – Federal Level

- **21st Century Community Learning Centers** – 10 million dollar increased from last year (2017 \$1,1 billion)
 - *Hawai'i 2018 Estimate \$5,937,198*
- **Title I Grants to Local Education Agencies:** \$15.860 billion, \$100 million more than FY2018 funding.
- **Title IV Part F Full Service Community Schools:** \$17.5 million, level with FY2018.
- **Title IV Part A Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants:** \$1.170 billion (increased by \$70 million)
- **Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG):** \$5.276 billion, increased by \$50 million on top of the historic increase provided in FY2018.
- **Career, Technical and Adult Education** - The bill provides \$1.263 billion for career, technical and adult education programs, an increase of \$70 million over FY2018,
- **Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS):** The agreement includes \$1.083 billion for CNCS, an increase of \$19 million over fiscal year 2018
- **Opioids & Mental Health:** The conference agreement provides \$3.8 billion in Health and Human Services for programs addressing opioids and mental health, an increase of \$206 million over FY2018.
