


Overview

- ◆ Hawai'i Afterschool Alliance in collaboration with the Charles S. Mott Foundation
 - ◆ Available funding of up to \$5,000 for the SY22-23 to increase youth entrepreneurship opportunities for youth through afterschool programs across Hawai'i
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Overview

- Organizations may apply for one or multiple program sites that serve 6-12th grade youth
 - Length of funding: July 2022 - May 2023 (School Year 22-23)
 - Awarded programs are encouraged to collaborate with their school, existing afterschool programs, and community/business partners
 - Hawai'i Afterschool Alliance will provide training opportunities, free curriculum, and technical assistance
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Goals & Objectives

- Increase entrepreneurial opportunities in the OST space for middle/intermediate and high school youth
- Increase the number of youth in Hawai'i exposed to entrepreneurship opportunities and programs
- Increase Hawai'i's youths' entrepreneurial mindset
- Sustain entrepreneurship programming through afterschool programs with capacity to do their own entrepreneurship trainings

Eligibility

- ◆ Afterschool programs in Hawai'i working with 6-12th grade students
- ◆ Schools and organizations may apply for multiple program sites. You must submit one proposal and one budget per organization
- ◆ Programs are not required to have an existing entrepreneurship component



Expectations of Awarded Programs

- ◆ Minimum of 1 day/week for at least 12 weeks of afterschool programming
 - ◆ Must be culturally responsive and grounded in the culture and context of Hawai'i
 - ◆ One person from each organization must participate in the entrepreneurship trainings offered
 - ◆ Participate in post VentureLab surveys
 - ◆ Submit a mid-year and year-end form
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Highly Encouraged

- Focus on engaging Native Hawaiian students in entrepreneurship
- Host a pitch showcase for their youth and participate in HAA's pitch showcase in Spring 2023
- At least one person from each organization participate in a train-the-trainers training in Spring 2023
- If applicable, collaborate with other programs at the same school who also receive this funding

Funding Timeline

- Application Released: April 11
- Informational Webinar: April 19, 10:00 AM
- Application Deadline: May 13**
- Notification of Funding Awards: June 1
- Trainings: Summer TBA
- HAA Conference & Training: August 26-27, 2022
- Trainings: Winter TBA
- Mid-year forms due: December 23, 2022
- Train the trainers: Spring 2023
- HAA Pitch Showcase: April 2023
- VentureLab Surveys: May 2023
- Year-end forms due: June 16, 2023



Payment Schedule

Organizations may request up to \$5,000. The funding will be given out in 3 payments

- ◆ 50% upon signing the Agreement of Services
- ◆ 25% in December 2022
- ◆ 25% once the final year-end form is submitted

Program Expenses

- ◆ Staff salaries
- ◆ Instructor stipends/salaries
- ◆ Transportation
- ◆ Snacks
- ◆ Prizes/incentives
- ◆ Curriculum
- ◆ Equipment
- ◆ Mileage reimbursement
- ◆ Supplies/materials
- ◆ Event costs
- ◆ Printing
- ◆ Marketing

Indirect Expenses

Proposals will not be considered with indirect costs above 10%

- ◆ Computer software
- ◆ Maintenance/Office repairs



Application Components



Organization Description

- ◆ Your mission, organizational and program goals, program structure, program outcomes, youth served, etc.



Project Description (50 points)

- How will this project enhance your afterschool program?
- If you don't plan on using one of our recommended curriculum, which Entrepreneurship curriculum/activities do you plan to implement and/or utilize?
- Organization's commitment to entrepreneurial programming.



Partners (20 points)

- ◆ Who will you partner with on this project?
- ◆ Will you include new partners?



Outcomes of the Project (30 points)

- What are your anticipated outcomes?
- How will you increase entrepreneurship opportunities in the out-of-school time space for students?
- How will you increase the number of students exposed to entrepreneurship opportunities and programs?
- OPTIONAL: How will you increase the number of Native Hawaiian students exposed to entrepreneurship?
